How do you float it? With Water! How do you get it underway? With Wind! How do you keep it together? by Having Fun!

Several owners of MacGregor 25's and 26's got together on November 7th to ponder these important questions and determine if there was enough interest to form a one design fleet at Lake Yosemite. The response from those in attendance was an overwhelming "yes". The main idea was to increase the opportunities for Fun With Wind on the Water by forming a group that would allow for learning and improvement of sailing technique, improvement in boat rigging, increased knowledge of racing rules and strategy and competition.

The group considered lots of ideas for ways to accomplish these goals; they included holding a one design race series for Mac's on a night other than Thursdays, (One thought was to hold a three race series every other month or so and to include a before or after race discussion or seminar on race tactics, sail selection, sail trimming, racing rules or any other topic of interest), having a one design fleet participate in the Dick Gardner one design regatta that the club already sponsors, the third and final idea was to participate as a fleet within the non spinnaker fleet on Thursday nights like the Catalina 22 fleet does already. No final decisions were made, on a particular race schedule, but a racing format was determined we will use the Northern California PHRF rules to govern the fleet with the limitation that spinnakers are not allowed (this decision can easily be revisited on an annual basis). 5 boat owners showed their interest at the meeting with two others who are also interested but were unable to attend. That is seven boats to start with and with a quick check of the group memory we figured there might be another five or seven MacGregor 25 & 26's out at the lake who might want to join the fun.

We also discussed lighter issues like, why is there air? But since Bill Cosby already answered that one, we moved on to what kind of pickle dish to sail for? (How about fleet ball caps or shirts for prizes? Does the fleet need a logo? Do we want to have non racing events? Cruising, safety seminars, safety of sailors at sea practice sessions, social gatherings etc.?)

The next step toward fleet formation is to present the idea to the LYSA board at their January meeting and decide on a calendar of events for the 2014 racing season.
